Damien Newton appointed as new Chair of the Planning and Land Use Committee at October hearing. Damien makes short statement promising to do his best.

A. Discussion with Option for Possible Motion to Support or Deny:

1. Atmosphere Cafe, 12034 Venice Blvd., case No. ZA-2016-3511-CUB; ENV-2016-3512-CE. Project Description: Conditional Use to allow the sale and dispensing of beer and wine for on-site consumption in conjunction with existing 1,176 square foot restaurant and proposed 772 square foot patio having 8 indoor and 41 outdoor seats for hours of operation 11:00 am to 11:00pm daily.

Lionel Arnault (restaurant owner) and Jonathan Yang (consultant) presented for the applicant who is hoping to begin dinner service soon. Newton reported receiving two pieces of mail in support of the project and none opposed.

Speakers in support of project include Auserwald and Doyno. Auserwald makes motion that MVCC support project. Doyon seconds. Motion passes unanimously.
