Discussed Penmar Encampment Pilot that relocated people quickly. R.W. Reported this has led to increased encampment and increased people in encampments in MV. Why don't we see turnover instead of same people every day at encampments? R.S. asked if no Project Roomkey, how do we move people quickly to clear encampments and repurpose? Hotels, shared housing. Participant discussed drug use, need to be sober for housing programs. Lack of resources for substance abuse.
