MOTION 1

Mayor Garcetti, Members of the Los Angeles City Council, and Members of the Los Angeles Board of Supervisors,

Our Los Angeles streets are overtaken by homeless encampments. These encampments provide cover for drug and human trafficking and related crime. Perpetrators prey upon our vulnerable homeless neighbors. They use them, and the cover of tents, to commit crimes. Enough.

Our City cannot afford the cost and time to provide every unhoused Angeleno an individual apartment with on-site supportive services. Safe-camping and safe-parking are the most immediate, cost-effective, and safe solutions to shelter our unhoused neighbors.

We therefore move that the City of Los Angeles, in collaboration with the County of Los Angeles, immediately fund and create appropriate safe-camping and safe-parking sites, with readily available onsite supportive services.

MOTION 2

Mar Vista Community Council (MVCC) Board of Directors,

Homelessness is a rapidly evolving crisis in our City. Our MVCC Homeless Issues Sub-Committee meetings are well-attended. Our housed and unhoused neighbors need solutions now. MVCC process requires our motions to be voted on by our parent committee before being forwarded to the MVCC Board for a third vote. Maintaining our Homeless Issues Sub-Committee under the purview of the Public Health and Safety Committee hampers our ability to provide timely communication directly to the MVCC Board. This communication may be ultimately directed to the City Council and other involved entities regarding homeless issues and proposed solutions, and, particularly, City Council motions.

We therefore move that our Sub-Committee be upgraded to a Standing Committee of the MVCC.
