At its regularly scheduled Board meeting held June 12, 2012, the Mar Vista Community Council approved the following resolution as our comment upon the DEIR, Casden Sepulveda Project (ENV-2008-3989-EIR, State Clearinghouse No. 2009061041:

Whereas the Casden Sepulveda Project (ENV-2008-3989-EIR, State Clearinghouse No. 2009061041) at the intersection of Exposition, Sepulveda and Pico (11122-11150 Pico Boulevard and 2431-2441 South Sepulveda Boulevard, Los Angeles, California) is a significant major development project proximate to a key Westside Phase 2 EXPO Line station, And whereas planning along the Phase 2 EXPO Line route is of paramount importance to surrounding communities with regard to convenient transit access; maintenance of adequate automobile north-south throughput for public safety; protection of jobs generating small businesses; preservation of scarce industrial zoning for long term economic health; and maintaining neighborhood character with buildings of appropriate size and scale, The Mar Vista Community Council recommends the project include:

- No residential component
- Preservation of scarce, jobs generating, Westside industrial land
- A downsized physical presence with step backs and setbacks adjacent to residential and other neighboring properties
- ·A parking structure; bus/rail transfer station; and pedestrian/bicycle amenities
- A plan with mitigations for maintaining long term small business presence along Pico and Sepulveda
- A more thorough traffic study and mitigation plan than in the DEIR. A plan for mitigation of regional traffic impacts, particularly for funding the grade separation of the Expo Line at Sepulveda Blvd.
- · A public park component and/or mitigation funds for regional open space
